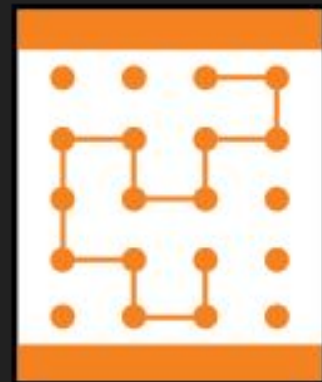

5. With other members of your den, invent a game, OR change the rules of a game you know, and play the game.

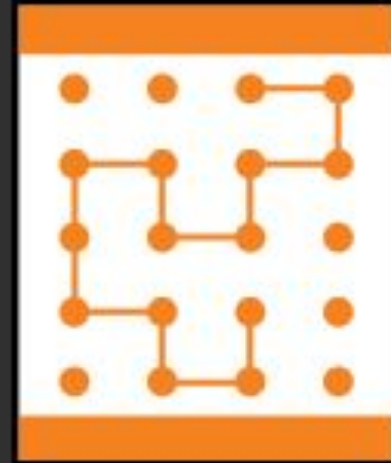

 - Hitting a baseball

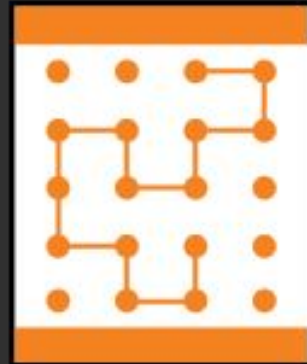
