Congratulations on reaching the rank of Eagle Scout!

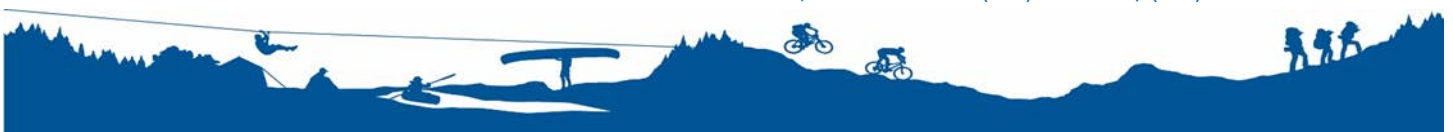
Presentation of the Eagle Scout Award is an important event to recognize and celebrate this pinnacle achievement. It should reflect the significance of the accomplishments of a new Eagle Scout; thus, must be well planned and coordinated.

Although an Eagle Court of Honor is typically organized by individual Units or a new Eagle Scout and their family, the Council Advancement Committee recommends considering the inclusion of the following elements:

- 1) Opening
 1. Pledge of Allegiance
 2. Scout Oath
- 2) Welcome & Introductions
 1. Recognition of Unit Leadership in attendance
 - 1.1. Key 3 – Unit Leader, Unit Committee Chair, Charter Organization Representative
 - 1.2. Other Charter Organization representatives (Pastor / Lay leadership / Officers)
 - 1.3. Unit Commissioner
 - 1.4. Retired Key 3 Leaders
 2. Recognition of District Leadership in attendance*
 - 2.1. Key 3 – District Director/Executive, District Committee Chair, District Commissioner
 - 2.2. Other District Representatives (e.g., Eagle Board of Review Representative of Advancement Chair)
 3. Recognition of Council Leadership present*
 - 3.1. Scout Executive / Assistant Scout Executive / Development Director
 - 3.2. Other Council representatives (e.g., Alumni Committee Member(s)/Chair or Advancement Committee Chair)
 4. Recognition of Distinguished Guests
 - 4.1. Eagle Project Beneficiary
 - 4.2. City/County/State government representative(s)
 5. Recognition of All Eagle Scouts present (*may be included elsewhere in program*)
- 3) Include any unit-specific traditions
- 4) Incorporate a ceremonial element that highlights the significance of the Eagle Rank
- 5) Incorporate a ceremonial element that highlights the specific accomplishments of the new Eagle Scout
- 6) Eagle Medal Presentation
- 7) Parents Pins Presentation
- 8) Closing
