## WEBELOS SLEEPOVER CAMP 2022

Webelos Sleepover Camp will be taking place at Ed Bryant Scout Reservation in Mauston, Wisconsin; 80 miles north of Madison. EBSR is nestled on a 2 mile shoreline on Castle Rock Lake; The fourth largest lake in Wisconsin! The pristine waterfront is just one of many things that make Ed Bryant Scout Reservation one the premier Scouting destinations in the Midwest. The Camp will run from **Sunday, July 31** through **Wednesday, August 3**. Webelos and Arrow of Lights are welcome to attend.

Scouts will be embarking on a Top Secret Mission: to find Bigfoot. In order to locate Bigfoot they will need to hone their secret agent skills by going to training at 6 different program areas: Aquatics, BB-Guns, Archery, SWAMP, Ecology-Conservation, and Field Sports. Once they have completed their training they will set out to complete their mission: GET BIGFOOT!

## CHECK-IN PAPERWORK

- **COVID-19 Screening Form**
  - This form will be provided to you upon arrival.
  - While this form is primarily for safety purposes it also allows us to know who exactly has arrived at our camp
- 2 Copies of **BSA Annual Health and Medical Record** for all Participants.
  - One copy is for you to keep with you in your campsite. The other copy is for our health officer. We retain these forms for 2 years.
- **Routine Drug Administration form** for all participants with medication.
  - Adult leaders will be provided with a lockbox for all medication for youth participants.
  - Youth participants can also check in medication with the health officer.
- **Youth Protection Certificates** for all adult leaders

# CHECK-IN PROCESS

- Each Pack will receive a call from the Camp Commissioner one week before your arrival at Ed Bryant Scout Reservation.
  - The Commissioner will arrange your arrival time between 12:00 PM and 3:00 PM.
  - They will also confirm and food allergies or special accommodations your Den may require.
- Upon arrival you will be greeted by our enthusiastic camp staff!
  - They will conduct a COVID-19 Health Screening.
  - They will distribute wrist bands to all adults and youth.
  - They will assign you a site commissioner.
- You will submit paperwork at the pavilion in the parking lot.
- Your site commissioner will take your Den on a tour of camp.
- Once the tour is complete you will have permission to begin setting up your campsite.
- Once your campsite is set up you can report to the Swim Beach for Swim Checks.

## DINING HALL

All meals will be served in Fellowship. We serve all of our meals 'Family Style' which means that scouts will sit in tables of eight. There will be food portions for the entire table that are then passed around from scout to scout. We will need one adult leader from each patrol to report to dinner 10 minutes early to help distribute food and utensils to their patrols tables.

## TRADING POST

The trading post is great place to grab camp souvenirs, creature comforts, snacks, slushies, and even camping gear. Forgot something at home? We may have it in stock. Just ask our Trading Post staff. The Program Center offers a number of activities including a giant chess set gaga ball pits, and more!

## Health Forms

Each person attending camp is required to have a completed (Parts A-C) Boy Scouts of America Health Form. This form needs to have the signature of the licensed health-care practitioner within the last 12 months and updated by parents annually. Immunization dates and medications must be listed on the health form in the appropriate area.

## Prescription Medication

Medications MUST be turned into unit leadership upon check-in on your first day of camp as well as notification of any severe allergies. Campers on prescription medication must complete the Prescription Medication Form, and return the completed form upon checkout. All forms are available on the council camping website. Medication will be administered by the adult leaders in sites. Medication must be kept secured, we can provide a lock box as needed. A camper may keep certain prescription medications, such as bee sting kits and inhalers on their person. This policy INCLUDES ALL ADULTS.

## Health Office

Ed Bryant Scout Reservation staffs a health officer that is on-call throughout your stay. This trained person is responsible for all health and safety at camp and is headquartered at the Health Lodge. The health lodge can provide basic first aid and over the counter medications as needed. Any care greater than basic first aid will be sent to Mile Bluff Medical Center in Mauston.

## Emergency Procedures

Complete emergency procedures will be reviewed at opening assembly. Procedures are posted at call camp information centers and campsites. An emergency drill will be conducted on Monday.

## Roster Verification

Leaders must verify that all Scouts and Scouters expected to attend camp are checked in, listed on the unit's camp roster and currently registered with the BSA. These rosters will be maintained by the camp for all Scouts and Scouters on reservation, we pull this information from Scoutingevent.com, so please ensure your roster is up to date prior to arriving. All Scouts, Scouters, and visitors in camp will wear an issued wristband(s) while at Ed Bryant Scout Reservation. Wristbands are worn during the entire stay in camp. If you notice anyone in camp who is not wearing a wristband, you should report them to a Staff Member as soon as possible.

## Illness

When a Scout or Scouter's health is in question prior to camp, it is better for that Scout or Scouter to delay their trip to camp. If any camper becomes ill during camp, it must be reported to the Health Officer. If a Scout becomes too ill to participate in the program, their unit leader and parents will be contacted regarding transportation home.
